



The Kusary

Our Holy Father, Pope John Paul II, has added "the mysteries of light" to the rosary that he announced last month to rekindle the interest among Roman Catholics in the 500-year-old form of prayer oriented to the "contemplation of Christ's face through Mary's eyes".

The new mysteries are "meant to give fresh life and rekindle renewed interest in the rosary's place within Christian spirituality," the Pope said.

The new mysteries are: Jesus' baptism in the River Jordan: his self-manifestation and miracles at the wedding at Cana; His proclamation of the Kingdom of God with his call to conversion; His transfiguration; and finally, His institution of the Eucharist at the Last Supper.

"At the beginning of the 25th year of my pontificate, I once again entrust to the Blessed Virgin Mary my ministry and the needs of humanity," the Pope said at his weekly general audience earlier last month.

"In honor of Mary, I sign the apostolic letter "Rosarium Virginis Mariae" (The Rosary of the Virgin Mary) which presents the rosary as an outstanding means of contemplating the face of Christ. I propose five additional mysteries of light—which expands the rosary to include Christ's public ministry."

"Where might the 'mysteries of light' be inserted?" the Pope writes. "If we consider that the 'glorious mysteries' are said on both Saturday and Sunday, and that Saturday has always had a special Marian flavor, the second weekly meditation on the 'joyful mysteries,' in which Mary's presence is especially pronounced, could be moved to Saturday. Thursday would then be free for meditating on the mysteries of light."

He also declared October, 2002 -October, 2003 the year of the Rosary.
