



of the Apostles, Simon and Jude; all of these apostles, if you stop to think about it, are spiritual heavyweights in the deepest sense of the term. Jesus chose twelve very ordinary, working class men and turned them, with the help of the Holy Spirit into incredible spiritual juggernauts who plowed into the Jewish and pagan worlds and mesmerized hundreds of thousands of these people into following Jesus even at the expense of accepting death rather than reverse course. This month. November, finds us celebrating both the feasts of All Saints and then All Souls; All Saints is a poignant reminder that not all the saints in heaven have been or will be declared blessed such as a Blessed Theresa of Calcutta. or saints such as St. Joseph Marello, the founder of my community, the Oblates of St. Joseph. I haven't the least doubt that my own mother, Margaret Russo, is among the saints in heaven and that she is always praying for me. All Souls is also a great reminder that many souls have to be completely purified from detachment to worldly things before being allowed into heaven; my dad said his rosary every day and practiced great charity, but he had a southern Italian-sized temper and may have been sidetracked for it.

Near the end of November we will celebrate the great feast of Christ the King, another dramatic reminder of just who is running this world even though the members of the United Nations including the U.S.A. may sincerely believe they are the only true movers and shakers of our planet.

I see many of you at daily Mass and I know that you have great faith and are constantly praying for the whole world; and kindly pray for you chaplain who sorely needs to gain several pounds.
