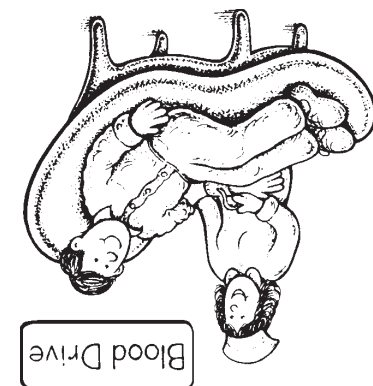

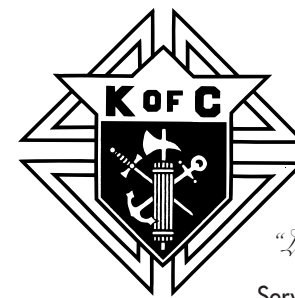

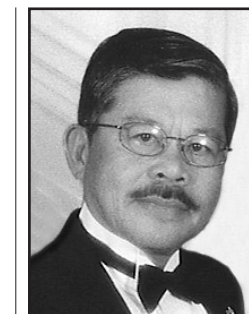

Grand Knight's Message

Brother Knights,

My wife and I just returned from a European pilgrimage, its meaning to us—we hope—shall never diminish in our lifetime.

We visited many religious places of significance in seven countries. Most notably we felt drawn to: "The Bleeding Host" (The Holy Miracle) of Santarem and Our Lady of Rosary of Fatima both in Portugal; a visit to the Shroud of Christ in Turin of Italy; places of Apparition of; Our Lady of Carmel in Santiago de Garabandal in Spain, Our Lady of the Immaculate Conception of Lourdes in France, and our Blessed Virgin Mary "Queen of Peace" in Medjugorje in Bosnia-Herzegovina.



We were among the thousands devotees, and amazingly with this number we were orderly and relatively quiet—considering. There

were large number of people in Medjugorje and just few of us (my group of 29 people in Garabandal), perhaps because of the off season time of the year there.

In Lourdes and in Fatima, we participated in the Mass and in the evenings, the candle light processions. Because of our number, one can imag-

Greetings and peace in the Lord.

This month begins the year of the Eucharist, as proclaimed by our Holy Father, John Paul II. There will be a Eucharistic Congress later this month in Mexico that will officially begin the year and then one next October to conclude the year. You might be aware that the Knights also sponsor a Eucharistic Congress each year in this country. What exactly is a Eucharistic Congress?

A Eucharistic Congress is an opportunity for Catholics to come together and learn more about this precious gift and source of unity in the Church. They do this by hearing presentations, reading about the Eucharist, but most of all by celebration and worship. Mass, Eucharistic adoration are the center piece of the Congress. They began in the middle part of the 19th century in an attempt to revive the fervor of Catholics for the Eucharist and to witness to a
