

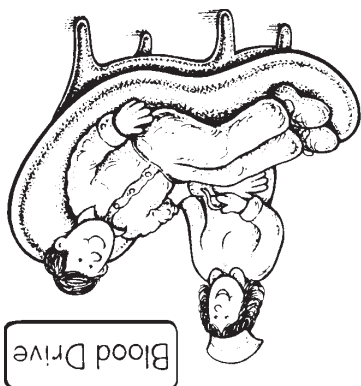

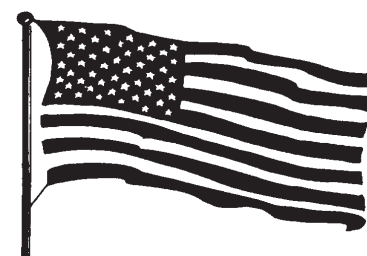

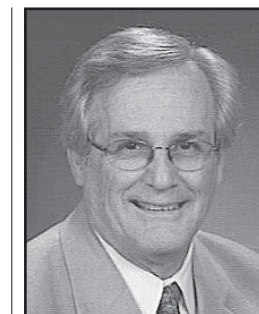
Grand Knight's Message
