# Chaplain's Message

The Three Propositions

There are four principal Eucharistic Prayers which are used during the litury of the Mass and they all end with this powerful proclamation: "Through Him with Him and in Him in the unity of the Holy Spirit all glory and honor is yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever." I would like to concentrate, if I may, on the three propositions which help to express our oneness and centrality with Christ in everything which we ought to do with Him.
