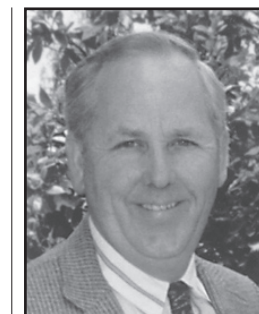

Luke reminds us in the first chapters of Mary who is full of grace, a virgin who conceives and gives birth, the ever Virgin. Elizabeth in her old age and infertile conceives John the Baptist and informs Mary that she is now in her sixth month "for nothing is impossible with God." In other words, with God all things are possible. Our Lord reminds St. Paul in his weakness: my graces sufficient for you. God's power becomes manifest in human weakness. With St. Paul we can say: I can do all things in Him who strengthens me. Human impossibilities can become Divine Possibilities. With Peter on the stormy Lake of Galilee we can cry out: "Lord, save me, for I am drowning." The Lord extended His hand and saved him. Oh, you of little faith, why did you doubt?

The results of the Order's annual Survey of Fraternal Activity for the year ending December 31, 2007, show that total contributions to charity at all levels reached \$144,911,781.

Volunteer hours by Knights for charitable causes grew to 68,695,768 hours.

There were 393,030 Knights of Columbus blood donors and Knights made more than 5.5 million visits to the sick and bereaved.

During the past decade, the KofC has donated nearly \$1.28 billion to charity, and provided in excess of 612 million hours of volunteer service.
