

Chaplain's Message

ADJUSTMENTS

One of the things we have to do in our life experiences is to make adjustments to the situations that we have to confront every day of our lives. We must adapt so as to not become inflexible; otherwise we will break. Society and culture are good examples of adapting to the environment in which we find ourselves: human weakness, ignorance, the inexperience of youth, the dusk of old age, social, economic and political realities, as well as foreign and domestic problems. Multiple are the challenges and decisions must be made daily according to the lights that we have received, and the gifts which we have or have not. Though this may be true to a point, we know and feel after reflection and prayer

that often we must go against the grain, the common wisdom of the times, the common sense of the people, to make drastic and fundamental changes which many times cause hostilities, enemies, persecutions, hatred and, often times, death itself. Faith, the saints and the martyrs are good examples of this countercultural attitude.

Jesus Christ gives us an excellent example of healthy adjustment during His life on earth. He adjusted to sin by first recognizing it, and then dying for its destruction. He urged sinners to come to Him for forgiveness and not have sin be inevitable in their lives. Christ did not accept sin,


