

ies celebrated by the Rosary we see her presence implicit and explicit. If we look closely in the New Testament, we see her presence in the private and public life of Christ from the Annunciation to Pentecost - she is there in every phase of the life of Christ. The Mother of Jesus was present at the marriage feast of Cana, and the Mother of Jesus was there as she had been in Bethlehem, Egypt, Nazareth, in the public ministry of Jesus, at the foot of the Cross and with the gathering in the Cenacle before Pentecost. As she was present "there" she is also present "here".

The other adverb "here" is important as well. She is present now in her many apparitions down through the centuries. She is here now in the Month of May and in the Month of October. From our mothers we have come into contact with the Second Mother, Mary. She is found in the Book of Hours, in the Mass, in the Rosary and in the mind and heart of every Catholic. Saturday is dedicated especially to her. She is invoked by popes, bishops, priests, religious and lay folk. She intervenes with her Son for us. She is concerned in mind and heart for us. We are her other sons and daughters complementing her relationship with Jesus. So, just as she was "there", she is now "here" with us. Let us invoke her now and at the hour of our death. Amen.




