

## Grand Knight's Message

Brother Knights & Families,

An article in the latest Columbian magazine featured the struggle to keep a statue of Jesus on a mountain in Montana. For almost 60 years the statue has honored the veterans who fought in the Second World War. The U.S. Forest Service had granted the '10th Mountain Division Memorial, near Whitefish, Montana, a ten year extension. The Knights of Columbus of Kallispill Council #1328 have maintained the statue over the years and petitioned the Forest Service to let it stay at this location near the ski lift. It is too delicate to survive a move to a new location. After the permit was issued the "freedom from religion foundation," a Wisconsin-based group, formally filed a suit to block the renewal of the permit. U.S. Rep. Denny Rehberg fought to keep the permit in place. Rehberg said, "Re-



moval of this symbol of hope and faith is an insult to the sacrifices they so willingly gave our great country."

During the Lenten season let us think about our active duty and retired military and the sacrifices they make every day to keep us safe. - Flan and Pan Dulce for dessert


