



Chaplain's Message

EXCUSES

There are many reasons why people do not come to Christ. The Gospel according to Matthew in Chapter 22 gives three or four excuses. The Father is preparing a wedding feast for his son, and he sends out invitations to all. Some receive the invitation and ignore it, while others have no time because they must work on their farm. Others insist they have no time because of their businesses. Others finally insult those who bring the invitation. Some they insult, others

they persecute and others they finally kill. The invitation is sent to all. We can accept it or refuse to accept it according to our free will. The invitation is to Christ and His Church and is freely given, and likewise must be freely accepted. The consequences are not free. They flow necessarily from our acceptance or refusal. We can either share the joy of the wedding feast or the emptiness of absence. Of course, there exist many modifications of these excuses.

During my years as a priest I have heard of many excuses for not coming to the marriage feast of the mass, the sacrifice of Christ. Some say that they really do not need it, others state that those who go are hypocrites, and others proclaim they are too busy. Others insist their family and marriage are sufficient while some say that religion is for the weak, or for crises, death, Christmas and Easter, or that we can pray at home. Finally, they say "I want to do my own thing." Christ did not excuse himself for coming and dying for us. The Father invites and the Son comes to those who accept his invitation. When death comes, the invitation will no longer be available for those who refuse. The refusal will become final. Now really is the acceptable time, the time of salvation.

Raising Awareness About Life Insurance

Since 2003, each September has been designated as Life Insurance Awareness Month.
