

THE THREE MOODS

This month is dedicated to the
rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary.
We have said many things about the
rosary in past articles, some from the
point of view of Mary; others from
the point of view of Christ, such as
the mysteries. It is the common and
popular prayer of the people of God

and has been in constant use even to-
day. This time I would like to tackle
it from another point of view: that of
the three moods or movements which
are found in the fifteen decades of
the rosary: joy, sorrow and glory.
Each of these reflects the three basic
experiences that Mary had, as well as

her son Jesus, and likewise us as well. We feel joy as we grow and feel in our relations and environments. These in turn are mixed with sorrow and drawbacks and forced detours. They all reflect not only life as it is and is felt, but also the spiritual life in its unfolding.

The popularity and commonality of the rosary today is also in tune with daily life, making it the com-



mon prayer of millions. It is both natural and supernatural. It appeals to the unlearned and the learned. It is repetitious, yet each time more profound. It remains the same and then

grows on you. It is mysterious and yet known. It is easy to say and then difficult to comprehend fully. It speaks to the mind and to the heart. It feels and thinks. It holds in brief all the mysteries of faith. It speaks to me and I answer to it: Hail Mary full of grace... Holy Mary, Mother of God. pray for me now and at the hour of my death. Yes, it is a prayer of joy mixed with sorrow, but ultimately the two lead to glory. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for me now and especially at the hour of my death. Amen. God bless.


Membership

Insurance

The added value of LTC insurance
