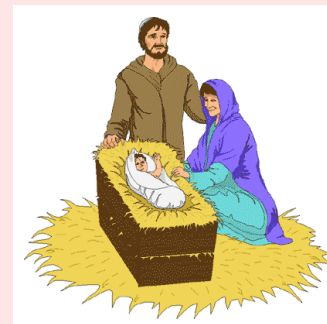

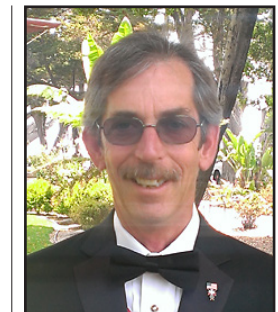

Chaplain's Message

THE SPIRIT OF CHRISTMAS

Christmas is the most interesting period of my life. It was for me as a child and it is more so now. It is a period in which reality and fantasy come together in a special mix. There is, of course, a wrong way of preparing for this great event and a right way. The wrong way is the following: It is a period of winter break alone, a time to celebrate with interminable parties, to put on a few pounds and then feel guilty in the new year, a time to see friends and participate in family gatherings, to spend long hours at airports, to madly shop, to wish everyone we meet "Happy Holidays" or to greet everyone with "Seasons Greetings"

in private or public encounters and, by the way, to avoid God as much as possible, especially the birth of His Son Jesus. Slowly, but surely, the true meaning of Christmas is disappearing from the landscape and the minds of people.

The true spirit of Christmas has a biblical, liturgical and personal spiritual preparation basis: the expectancy period: the Prophets of the Old Testament, especially Isaiah, Micah. In the New Testament Matthew and Luke, which reference the Virgin birth and Bethlehem. Liturgically, we get into the spirit of preparation by attending Mass during the four weeks of Advent

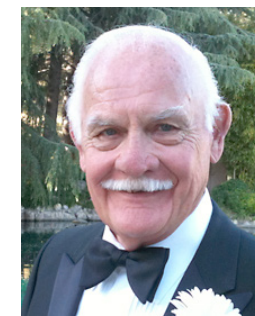
