## Chaplain's Message

Dear Brother Knights:

This year's Boston Marathon on April 16 was run under the most brutal conditions imaginable: sharp whipping winds, frigid temperatures and torrential rain battered the runners along the 26-mile route. This is where I would like to highlight Mary Shertenlieb. This was her first marathon ever, a special one because it has been five years since she was diagnosed with an aggressive form of leukemia. The 42-year old mother of two

decided to run Boston to raise money for the Dana-Farber Cancer Institute. About halfway through the marathon, she was pretty well soaked and cold, lips purple and shaking with chills. She was urged to stop running by medical personnel. Fighting through her tears, she telephoned her husband of the news. Knowing her frustration, he suggested that she return home, take a warm shower and get some real clothes on. At 8:00 p.m. that evening,

long after the marathon had ended, Mary and her husband, Rich, picked up where Mary left off and finished the remaining 10.7 miles of the race. Sometimes they trotted, much of it they walked. Just after midnight, the crossed the "finish line" in downtown Boston, where they were met by police and volunteers and friends and fans, as Rich alerted friends and supporters of their plans on social media.

Mary had already met a \$15,000 fundraising goal for Dana-Farber, but when word about her "unusual" marathon path got out, donations soared beyond \$40,000. She remarked afterwards: "I never thought I would feel this happy being in last place! I imagined crossing that finish line and I crossed it differently and I crossed it last, but I feel more fulfilled having it this way."

My brothers, the voice of Jesus speaks to us in the encouragement and support of others calling us beyond the fears, misgivings and doubts that stop from embracing life to the full. Jesus speaks in the voices of those who reveal the grace of God's presence in our everyday lives and who challenge us to be the means of that grace for others. May we hear the peace and stillness of Jesus in the "marathons" of grief and hurt and despair we all ride out at times in our lives.


