





nence period slightly less than that of Lent. Why so? One of the first things any member of a religious community learns in that first year of basic training in the meaning of the religious vows and the rule of the community, a year called the novitiate, is that in order to begin a life of total consecration to God, a religious must learn to gradually strive for perfection in the observance of all of the religious virtues. As one who has been through novitiate and everything following it, I can tell you that it was the most intense year of my life, second in stress only to my preparation for ordination to the priesthood.

Generally God does not expect the same effort from the laity whose vocations as spouse, breadwinner, mom or careerist require a different way of practising virtue, but I can tell you that in the brief time I have been your chaplain, I am absolutely amazed and humbled by the obvious depth of charity and zeal I have seen on the part of so many Knights and their spouses.

This is the work of the Holy Spirit and I am privileged to behold it.
