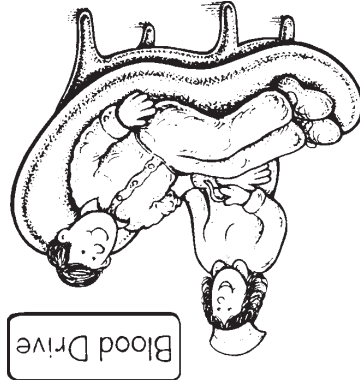

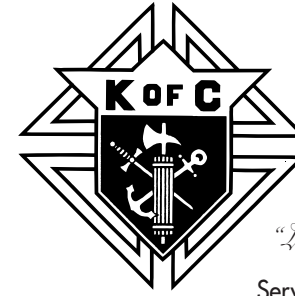

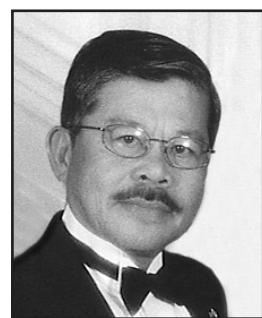

### MEMBERSHIP

The state of our Council's membership is not good. In January, 2004, we started with 153 total members. In December, we are down to 141 members (13 of whom were classified Inactive by the Supreme Office). Our losses were due to; death, withdrawals, transfers & suspensions. We managed to add 2 new members, but our losses far exceeded our gain.

In July, at the beginning of my tenure, and subsequently thereafter in this Newsletter, I gave you several reasons as to why this Council need you. I reported to you that our attendance at both our business & social meetings were "anemic" at best. And that for us to survive as a council, we need your participation and put MEMBERSHIP RECRUITING a priority, as a condition of you being a Knight. You need only to review the statistics I gave you



in my September message for you to realize some more of the gravity of our membership status.

So, what shall we do? I ask all Of-

ficers and Activity Directors to have a meeting 1-1/2 hour before the Council's regular business meeting on Wednesday, Jan 12, 2005 at the Hall. 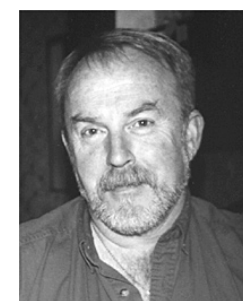

(and rainy!) California to our new home in Michigan. My time here with Council 971 has been a true joy; getting to know you all and serving our

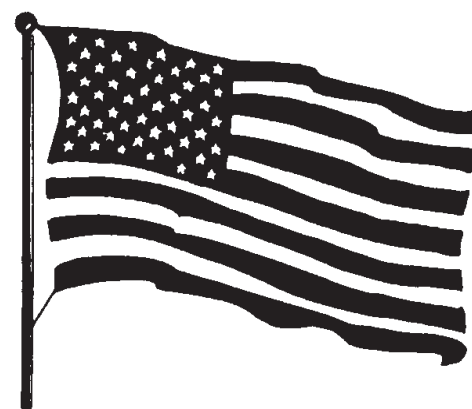
Church and community. I take with me the attitude of service that I've learned while in Council 971 and will continue in that service in our new home.
