
Grand Knight's Message

The Creator has no room in the inn of the world society, schools, political sphere, family, marriage, and home. We try to

Ruperta & Virginia also arranged the table centerpieces.


Jack Kemerling prepared mashed potato, stuffing and gravy and hors d'oeuvre...Jack was very helpful!
