
Grand Knight's Message

THE GREAT ANNOUNCEMENT

The month of March is dedicated to St. Joseph and, if you are Irish, St. Patrick comes in a close second. But we forget that we celebrate another feast which is even greater than the two previously mentioned: the Feast of the Annunciation of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This certainly is the greatest of all the announcements which were made in history and, if I may be bold to say, that will ever be made in the future. In Luke Chapter One after the announcement of St.

John the Baptist there is the greater announcement of Our Lord Jesus Christ. In the sixth month of the year an angel named Gabriel was sent by God to a town of Galilee named Nazareth to a virgin named Mary, betrothed to a man named Joseph, of the house of David. Mary and Joseph are mentioned side by side in this great announcement. Both are to be the participants in the mystery of the incarnation of the Son of God. The Virgin Mary received the message

and Joseph helps to implement it in his own life. The message and the consent of Mary are shared by St. Joseph.

The declaration follows after the encounter: Rejoice, O highly favored daughter, for the Lord is with you and blessed are you among women. Troubled by this greeting because of her humility, the angel Gabriel adds: you should not be

afraid since you have found favor with God - you will conceive and bear a son who will be named Jesus who will be great since He is the Son of God and will possess the throne over the house of Jacob forever. The question: I do not know man, the angel answers: It is by the Holy Spirit that this event will take place. Then to this great announcement, the great answer by Mary is given: I am your total servant and let it be done as exactly as you say. So it happened two thousand years ago and therefore we are here today with Jesus Christ and with Joseph and also with Patrick and all the other saints. So we are also here today with the beautiful feast of Mary on March the 25th, the Feast of the Annunciation of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Forever Jesus and Mary, also Mary and Joseph and you and I as sons and daughters of this Holy Family. We share in this great announcement and the Virgin's great consent. May we always consent to the Lord and all He asks of us as well.

Insurance

Two important additions to a disability insurance policy

If you make the commitment to protect your future income by buying disability insurance, look closely at any available extra coverage ("riders") — some can add considerable long-term advantages at a moderate cost.

Two of the riders available with a Knights of Columbus Income Armor policy are a Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA) and a Guaranteed Purchase Option (GPO).

COLA: Each year, the benefits your policy provides for disabilities that last more than one year will increase to help compensate for inflation. Medical costs continue to increase significantly each year, and that trend isn't likely to change anytime soon.

GPO: At some point after buying your Income Armor policy, you may see a need to increase the base monthly benefit for which you're eligible. Without this rider, the increase would be subject to a medical exam. If you've developed a health condition that makes you medically ineligible, you wouldn't have that option. With the rider, you don't need to provide evidence of medical insurability.

Other Income Armor riders may be available in our state that would enhance your coverage. If you don't have disability insurance or you have it through work but don't know how much protection it actually provides — let have a discussion to see if Income Armor makes sense for you.
